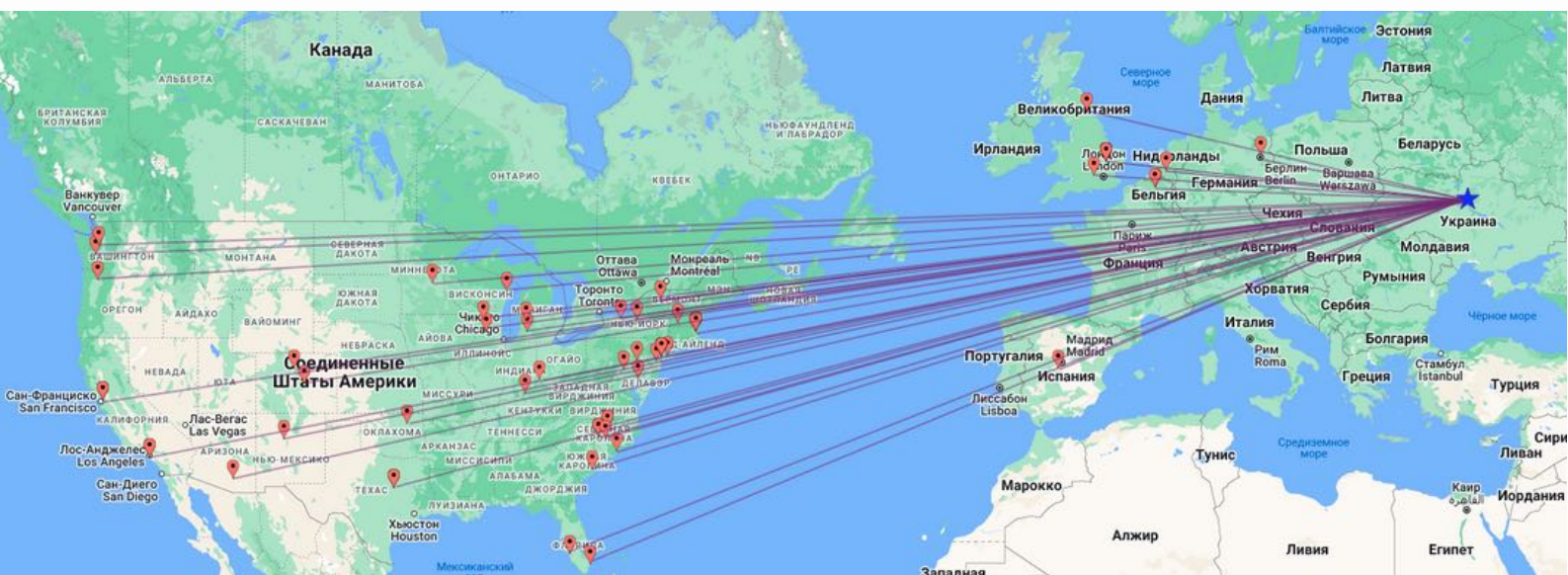

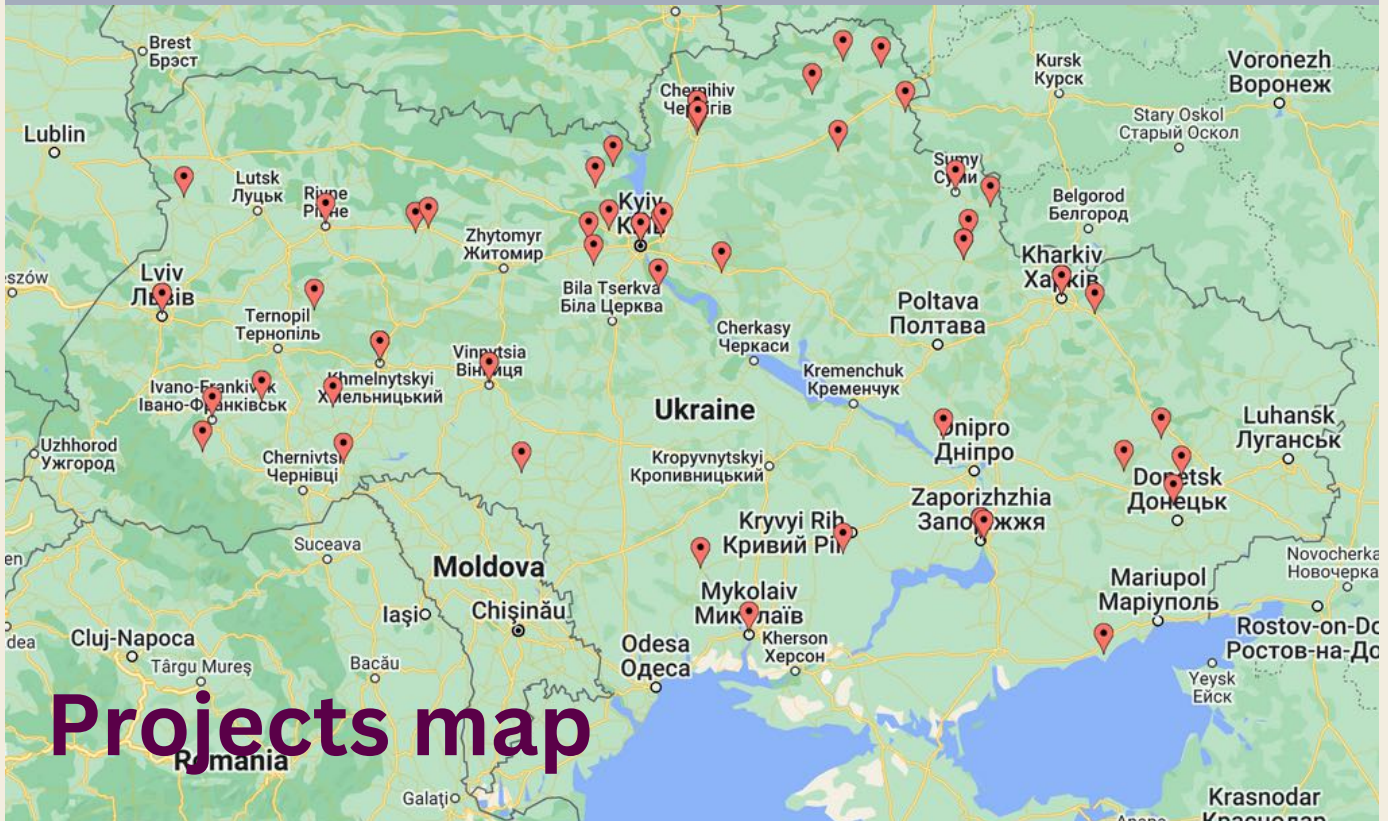

# Project profile

**NGO "Community Development Fund", Donetsk oblast, project "Development of the community's ability to process surplus agricultural products and improve food security"**

As a result of hostilities, a large part of agricultural land in Ukraine was lost, which led to a general loss of crops, including in private farmlands. Part of the food processing factories was also damaged or destroyed.

The project was aimed at creating a space for processing agricultural products which will also provide support to small private households. In the implementation of the project, a space for processing products was created, 2 drying chambers were purchased and IDPs were involved in the work. It was the apple harvesting time, so 1000 of apples were processed in the course of the project.

# Project profile

## CF Community Foundation of Voznesensk, Mykolaiv oblast, project "Warmhouse"

The project was aimed at strengthening the food security in the town by means of increasing the individual agro-production. The war influenced the situation with food supplies - some of the food markets were destroyed by warfare and the food supply chains in the region were broken due to the occupation of Kherson region.

Community Foundation of Voznesensk conducted 7 trainings on the basics of growing various types of produce that can be grown in the region. 127 individual consultations were provided. IDPs that moved to Voznesensk as well as local residents participated in the project that at the same time helped the integration of IDPs into the local community.

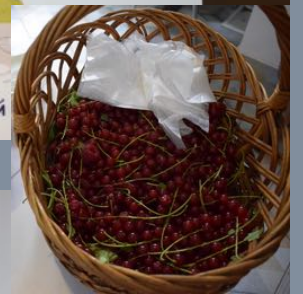
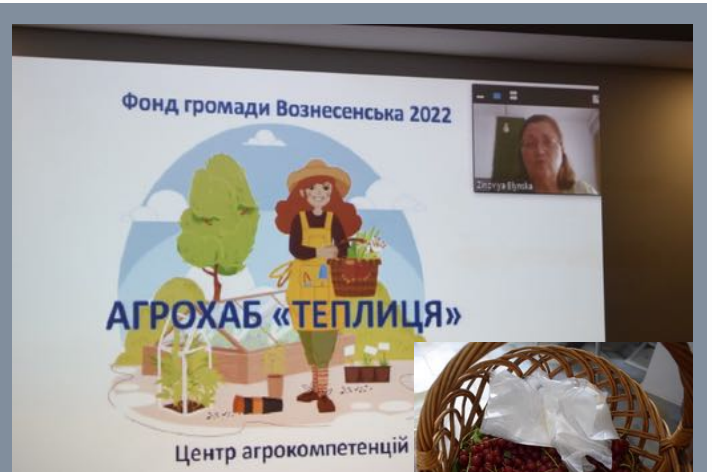

# Project profile

## NGO "Development and well-being of the community", Kyiv oblast, project "Youth space of the unconquered"

Village Yasnogorodka in Kyiv oblast has suffered greatly from the warfare that took place on its territory. The village was liberated and people returned to their homes or got back to living their lives together with their kids, of course. The project was aimed at refurbishing 2 rooms of the library and turning them into in the youth center where young people could spend their free time.

Thanks to the funding it was possible to repair 2 rooms purchase new equipment, furniture, and supplies for creative master-classes and sports club.

# Project profile

## CF "Chyste Polissya", Zhytomyr oblast, project "Arrangement of temporary shelters for IDPs in Horodnytske and Yarunske communities"

Numerous IDPs moved to Zhytomyr oblast after the war started. The project was aimed at improving conditions of sleep for displaced persons and people affected by the war while they were arranged permanent accommodation.

Two shelters of temporary stay received pillows and blankets for IDPs - 30 sets of pillow and blanket each.

# Project profile

## CF "Unconquered Kharkiv", Kharkiv oblast, project "Baking happiness"

Kharkiv oblast was partially occupied in the beginning of the war. In the end of September these territories were liberated. In order to support people on the de-occupied territories where supply chains were destroyed by the occupation the project "Baking happiness" was created. The project provided people in the de-occupied territories with home-baked bread, buns and sweets. Conducting 2 master-classes for children on gingerbread decoration was also a part of reintegration plan.

In the course of the project freezer, food processor, baking oven and bread fermentation cabinet were purchased. All manufactured products were sent to at least 11 different towns and cities.

# Project profile

## NGO "Strong people of Okhtyrka", Sumy oblast, project "Installation of windows in Rosinka kindergarten"

The project was aimed to restore "Rosinka" kindergarten and create proper conditions for children's education and upbringing. The kindergarten was damaged because of the constant air and rocket attacks on the city of Okhtyrka.

In the course of the implementation of the project, the kindergarten with bomb shelters was restored - new roof, windows and doors were installed. 200 children can go back to their kindergarten and their parents can go back to work knowing that their kids are taken care of.

# Project profile

## NGO "Source of Public Initiatives", Chernihiv oblast, project "Fata Morgana 2022"

The project was aimed at creating safe conditions for the education of the children of the Vykhvostov Gymnasium through the arrangement of the premises.

One of the main problems in war conditions is that children cannot study properly. To improve conditions of safety, a basement shelter was arranged. Cooler with water heater, radio, Wi-Fi router, fire extinguishers and first-aid kits were purchased as well as 60 caremats for seating.

# Project profile

## Trostyanyets Regional CF "Dobrota", Sumy oblast, project "Restoration of the first link of medical care in the liberated Trostyanyets community"

In February-March 2022, the Russian occupiers caused enormous damage to the medical facility of the Trostyanyets community.

The project was aimed at the complete restoration of the Trostyanyets primary medical care center by replacing the damaged metal-plastic windows and doors in the premises. In addition, thanks to the project, the conditions for the stay of patients and employees of the institution were improved by increasing its energy efficiency.

# Project profile

## NGO "Agency for Effective Development", Ponory, project "Satisfying basic needs of IDPs"

The project was aimed at improving living conditions of 20 IDP families and integrating them into the life of the local community.

Based on the IDPs needs assessment the supplies for those who lost their homes were purchased in frames of the project. Two suppliers provided gift sets - cutlery and bed linen. The excursion to Mezunsky Natural park was organized for the IDPs. The transportation was provided by the municipality. The implementation of the project improved connections of the NGO with the local authorities and allowed to dive deeper into the IDPs' problems.

# Project profile

## NGO "Center of Initiatives of Toretsk Entrepreneurs", Toretsk, project "Creating conditions for timely medical assistance"

The project was aimed at provision of local hospital with generators, water pumps and containers - blood transfusion department and surgery departments were equipped.

As of application submission date Toretsk community had 30,000 inhabitants (7,000 of them are children). After the shellings in March 2022 town's water supply plant was damaged (located on the occupied territory with no possibility to restore) as well as electricity supply plant, and the hospital was left without power and water supply. Due to the project implementation, two departments of the hospital were able to operate serving local community.

# Project profile

## NGO "Useful People of Avdiivka", Avdiivka, project "Cooking Options for Inhabitants of Avdiivka"

The project was aimed at improving living conditions of those inhabitants who was not evacuated from Avdiivka.

Avdiivka is on the frontline of warfare, it lost electricity and gas supply almost right after the beginning of the full-scale invasion. Those community members who could not be evacuated were forced to cook on an open fire using the wood they could find. At the same time being in a open space in the town which is constantly under attacks is very dangerous. Implementation of the project allowed to provide 34 families with gas bags for cooking food inside their homes. Earlier 70 gas stoves were purchased in frames of another project.

# Project profile

## NGO "Initiative citizens of Chemerovechchyna", village Kochubiiv, project "My second home"

The project was aimed at creation of comfortable conditions of living for IDPs by means of creation of hostel for IDPs, integration of IDPs into the local community and preservation of infrastructure objects of the community.

Old school premise in Kochubiiv village was refurbished as hostel for internally displaced people. The building will host 45 people - 23 women, 7 men, 15 children. Grant funding allowed to install a heating system, equip bathrooms and laundry as well as canteen for new members of the community.

## NGO "Agency of the regional development Pribuzhzhya", Volodymyrska and Novovolynska communities, project "Safe education"

The project was aimed at equipping bomb shelters in schools of Volodymyrska and Novovolynska communities and conducting trainings for 147 teachers on the conduct during air-raid alarms, informational security and stress resistance for teachers and pupils in order to provide conditions for safe education for children and teachers.

Shelters in two schools were equipped with seating benches and one of the schools received computer equipment - laptop, beamer, screen, and router. 12 trainings were conducted for teachers.

# Project profile

## CF "Our Peremoha", Peremoha village, project "Peremoha Restoration 2022"

The project was aimed at the restoration of old age home in Peremoha village after the occupation - the facility was in urgent need of the repair so that evacuated inhabitants could return to the familiar walls, but in better, more dignified conditions.

60% of repair materials and works cost was funded by the grant, the rest of the amount was raised and financed by the Foundation. 80 inhabitants of the old age home (both elderly and their caregivers) live in better conditions now and the community is able to accept new residents, if needed.

# Project profile

## CF "Development promotion", Kyiv oblast, "Building toloka" project

During the attacks on the capital, the villages of Shevchenkive, Bohdanivka, and Zalissya of the Kyiv region were under occupation for a month and suffered significant housing destruction. The project was aimed to create a free of charge equipment rental service for community members to rebuild their households.

Construction tools were purchased in frames of the project, community members informed about the possibility to rent necessary tools for reconstruction of their houses.

# Project profile

## NGO "Studenekivsky springs", Kyiv oblast, project "Ensuring uninterrupted water supply in Studenekivsk community"

The Studenikyvska hromada has a centralized water supply from 7 artesian wells. With the beginning of the war and further disruption of electricity supply due to the damaged infrastructure, the community faced the problem of lack of water supply.

The project was aimed at ensuring uninterrupted water supply for the residents of the community in wartime conditions - generators for three artesian wells were purchased.

# Project profile

## NGO "People need people", Zaporizhzhia oblast, project "Setting up a shelter for IDPs and people with disabilities in the city of Zaporizhzhia"

The project was aimed at solving the problems of temporary accommodation in the premises of the NGO "People need people" for IDPs with stay up to one week.

Within the framework of the project two rooms in the premises of the NGO were furnished with furniture and household appliances. Refrigerator, iron, vacuum cleaner and bed linen were purchased along with towels. 118 IDPs stayed in the shelter during project implementation (2 months), 67 psychological consultations were provided. Various events for children and adults were held: visit to a puppet theater, 15 + 9 therapy sessions, evening meetings with a fairy tale therapist from Germany for kids and adults.

# Project profile

## NGO "Spilno Hub", Zaporizhzhya oblast, project "Electric bicycles to support the sustainable mobility of social workers of the Shirokivska community"

Many IDPs and families who found themselves in difficult life circumstances and need constant social and medical assistance live in Shirokivska hromada (community). The closest clinic is located on the outskirts of Zaporizhzhya, so paramedic calls are in great demand. However, due to the cost of gasoline and other fuels, moving around the community becomes difficult for its workers.

The project was aimed at purchasing electric bicycles for hospital employees, water provision service and social workers assisting those in need at their homes.

## NGO "Inter-Regional Institute for Community Development, Konotop, project "Social Laundromat in Konotop community"

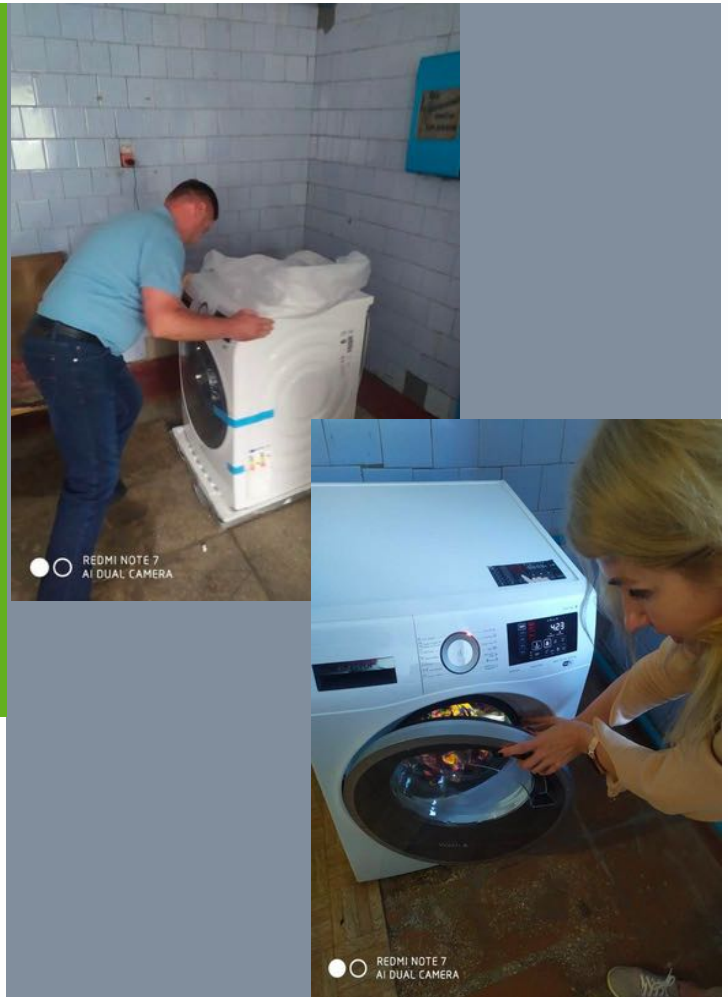
The project was aimed at providing vulnerable population of Konotop community (families having many children, families with low income, IDPs, etc.) with the social service of laundry by purchasing the professional washing machine for Konotop municipal bathhouse.

During the encirclement of Konotop the infrastructure of municipal bathhouse was greatly damaged and vulnerable strata of the local population and IDPs was left without the important service of laundry. The Institute was able to enlarge the circle of partners and is planning to use this opportunity to improve the life in the community.

# Project profile

## NGO "Agency of Regional Development "Solidarnist", Vinnytsya, project " Equipment for Blood Center"

The project was aimed at providing stable and sufficient stock of blood products for Vinnytsya region and other regions of Ukraine during the war by means of creating mobile blood drawing point.

Blood Centers' functioning during the war is extremely important - they assist both civilians and soldiers wounded by russian attacks and are able to save lives of Ukrainians. It is planned that during the first year 1,500 - 2,000 blood donations will be collected and the purchased equipment will allow to produce at least 1,500 doses of erythrocyte-rich components and 1,500 doses of blood plasma

# Project profile

## NGO "Syaivo Nadii", Berdyans'k, project "Mommy"

The project was aimed at improving the quality of life of pregnant women who fled from Mariupol to Berdyans'k - consulting on self-regulation and child-care, legal support and providing baby-packages for maternity hospitals.

This was the first project of the NGO aimed at the assistance to mothers-to-be. It was implemented at the occupied territory and was quite challenging for the staff, experts and volunteers. As a result of the project 58 future mothers participated in the project, instead of 45 as it was initially planned.

# Project profile

## NGO "Parents' Initiative of Khmelnytsky", Khmelnytsky, project "Safe Education"

The project was aimed at improving security in schools and assisting with equipment of the bomb shelters with benches for sitting.

37 schools were provided with 8-foot benches proportionally to the number of pupils in each school. In total 1230 benches were distributed. The project assisted also the economic security of the region as the benches were locally made by small private businesses. As a result of the project the NGO improved the connection with directors of all schools of the town, which will help it to achieve its mission.

# Project profile

## NGO "Space of Active and Modern", Lanivtsi, project "Children of the East and the West are united"

The project was aimed at uniting the kids of the East and the West, immersing them into the culture and traditions of the West, and raising patriotic spirit and unity.

The NGO conducted camps for 100 children from various parts of Ukraine aged 10-16 years old. Selected children represented vulnerable groups of both IDPs and local children of soldiers, children from families having many children and low-income families. Kids had the possibility to connect to their peers, have some great time together and to forget, at least for some time, about the terrors of war.

The project was aimed at distributing the available disinfectants among the hospitals of the city of Kyiv and Lviv, Khmelnytsky, Zhytomyr and Kharkiv oblasts of Ukraine as well as delivering the purchased ambulance from abroad to one of the hospitals in Zaporizhzhya.

The Foundation delivered the ambulance from Italy to Lviv and distributed 32 tons of disinfectants amongst 42 hospitals.

# Project profile

## NGO "Khotyn platform of culture and tourism", Khotyn, project "Equipping social kitchen for IDPs of Khotyn community"

The project was aimed at equipping social kitchen for IDPs of Khotyn community. 250 internally displaced people, families with low income, people with disabilities and other vulnerable strata of Khotyn community benefit from recently opened social kitchen.

The NGO purchased kitchen equipment (professional oven and stove) and furniture (tables and chairs) as well as sets of kitchenware in order to improve the services provided by social kitchen. 70 loafs of bread are baked in a new oven on a daily business and distributed amongst the shelters in the community.

# Project profile

## NGO "KISAR", Kyiv oblast, project "Energy supply - SOS"

The project was aimed at equipping 11 liberated communities in Kyiv, Chernihiv and Sumy oblasts with autonomous solar stations with inverters to power up objects of critical infrastructure in these communities.

Over 63 000 members of 11 communities will have the possibility to receive medical and other critical services due to the installation of the purchased environmental-friendly equipment. The type of equipment selected for the project was specially chosen so that it was able to provide medical and other facilities with alternating current that will not harm costly machinery.

# Project profile

## NGO "ProLife Ukraine", Bucha, Kyiv oblast, project "Happy childhood"

The project was aimed at installing 2 playgrounds for children in locations of compact living of IDPs.

Since the beginning of the war in Ukraine internally-displaced people were accommodated sometimes in places, that were not adapted to staying of children - in dormitories, monasteries, and other shelters. Consequently, children did not have a place to play and socialize with local kids, thus deprived of one of the most important parts of child's life - healthy leisure. The project facilitated installation of 2 playgrounds - at the territory of one of Bucha colleges and one of monasteries where IDPs live.

## NGO "Praktiko", Rivne, project "Creating the educational center for operators of sewing equipment"

The project was aimed at researching the field for further creation of the educational center for operators of sewing machinery.

Rivne oblast is famous for its sewing enterprises and as a lot of IDPs moved to Rivne oblast - the need to create the educational center was obvious. 2 researches were conducted in cooperation with regional authorities in order to see the real situation in the field. 11 IDPs has underwent training and were employed during the project. The waiting list has 95 people who are ready to undergo training and start working at one of the local sewing enterprises.

# Project profile

## Dniprovska district organization of The Red Cross of Ukraine in Kyiv, project "New look - new way of life"

The project was aimed at opening social hairdressing salon for IDPs and vulnerable groups of local population. Initially, it was planned to provide 120 services during the implementation of the project. Due to the high demand for this service it was possible to provide 267 services in frames of the project.

As the biggest part of the project budget was the purchase of the hairdressers equipment, the organization will continue to engage volunteers and provide these services to the local population and IDPs.

# Project profile

## Zaporizhzhya regional youth organization of deaf people "Our happy life", Stepnogirs'ka territorial community, project "Strong communities for strong people"

The project was aimed at equipping bomb shelters of the community with generators, solar-batteries powered lanterns, household and industrial water containers. Stepnogirs'ka territorial community suffered greatly from shellings - the biggest problems were with damaged power lines and water supply.

The project assisted to purchase 3 mini-power stations (generators), 20 lanterns, 4 water containers (1000 l), 50 water containers (5 l) and 14 water containers (60 l). In addition to that the organization has produced 2 educational videos "How to act in emergencies" with sign language translation for further distribution.

# Project profile

## CF "Liudyna", Shyroktiv community, Mykolaiv oblast, project "Restoration of critical infrastructure in the community under constant shellings"

The project was aimed at restoring the functioning of the critical infrastructure (water and electricity supply) in the community by means of the purchase of the generator and fuel for it. Along with that the community members were informed about necessary actions in case of shellings via distribution of the specially designed booklet.

Due to the implementation of the project 3562 inhabitants of Shyroktiv community have access to water and electricity supply. 150 packages of humanitarian aid were distributed to the most needy members of the community.

# Project profile

## CF "With warmth in our hearts", Gostomel and Moshchun, Kyiv oblast, project "Garden"

The project was aimed at providing local residents whose houses were damaged or destroyed with gardening and other tools for their households.

Gostomel and Moshchun are the first line of defence of Kyiv and heavy fighting was taking place there in February-April, until Kyiv oblast was liberated. Many families were left with destroyed houses and no tools to clear out the debris.

# Project profile

## CF "Kyiv Volunteersky", Kyiv oblast, project "Lypa"

In the village of Kolochivka, on March 8, 2022, a Russian rocket landed directly at the school. The school was destroyed.

The project was aimed at rebuilding the school. The main need was the restoration of a place where children could safely learn and go to kindergarten, because this school is the only institution in the village that combines premises of a kindergarten and a school.

Double-glazed windows were purchased in frames as a part of restoration efforts, understanding the urgent character and importance of the matter the seller provided the discount of 32% on the purchase.

35 days of occupation, without communication and the ability to communicate with the outside world. This is how the residents of Chornobyl region lived, the majority of them were elderly people.

The project was aimed at restoring the local volunteer center that was ruined during the occupation. The center is used for coordination of local initiatives, provision of psychological and social assistance to elderly people, as well as building a network of local coordinators for further development of social ties. 3 local coordinators trained, 48 psychological consultations were provided and 500 humanitarian packages were distributed.

# Project profile

## NGO Regional Development Agency "Solidarity", Vinnytsia oblast, project "Address assistance for IDP children with disabilities"

The project was aimed at helping IDP children with disabilities that limit the functions of the musculoskeletal system (cerebral palsy and other mobility-limiting diseases). Based on the analysis, children with disabilities 39 were identified among IDPs .

The NGO has provided specialized amenities for children and their families to provide short-term and long-term care - sets consisting of fixating, supporting, correcting, stimulating and calming, as well as anti-bedsores supplies.

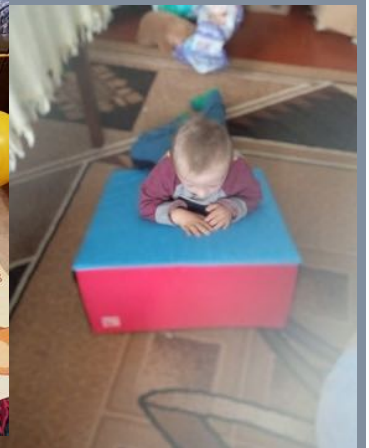

# Project profile

## Chuguyiv NGO "Association of parents of out-of-school Chuguyiv", Kharkiv oblast, project "Safety-Development-Children"

After the beginning of war Chuguyiv community is constantly targeted by russian missiles. As many of the families decided to stay in their homes, it became unsafe to conduct children's activities in designated areas.

The project was aimed at setting up a safe space in the basement of the building for classes with children and teenagers.

During the implementation of the project, the repair and arrangement of the space, where teachers can conduct group classes, was carried out. Children with special needs, from large families and IDPs are now involved in creative activities.

The project was created to help residents of the Ivankiv community who lost their homes as a result of Russian aggression. Therefore, modular towns where people live temporarily were made.

Thanks to the project, in order to create comfortable conditions for living, the modular towns were equipped with high-quality household appliances. Fridges, electric stoves, washing machines, irons, electric kettles, air conditioners, frying pans were purchased for residents.

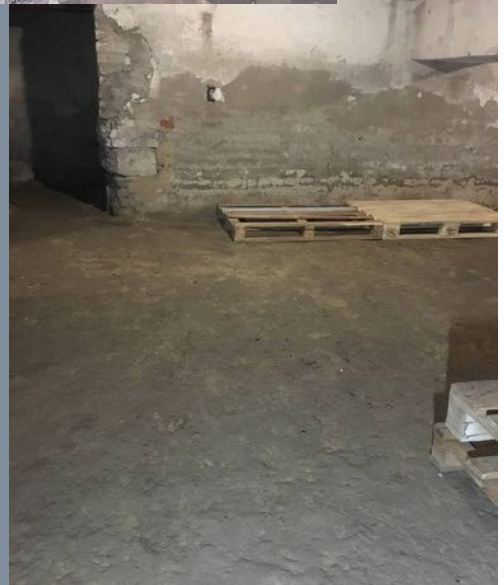
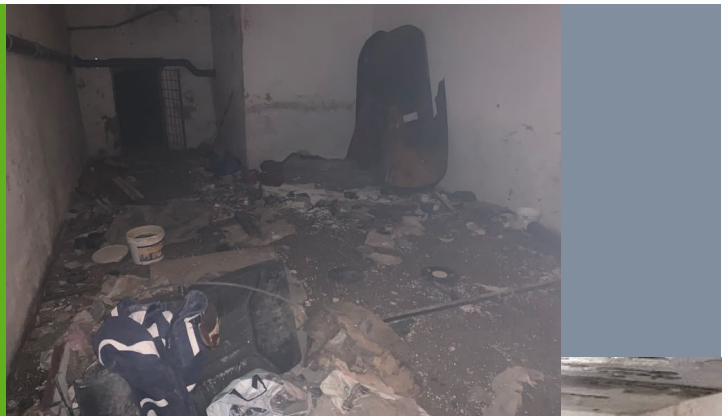
Residents of the city of Kharkiv, who live in areas where there is constant rocket attacks, do not have the opportunity to use comfortable bomb shelters.

The project was aimed at creating new safe bomb shelters for residents of dangerous areas of the city in the basements of selected houses. The part, funded in frames of PEOPLE to PEOPLE project was aimed at cleaning up, providing water and electricity supply, as well as sanitary equipment for shelters.

The project aimed at creating the possibility for the community to make dehydrated soup sets, dried fruits and berries, dried vegetables, etc. by means of creating a shop "Petrykivka Preserves". Necessary equipment was purchased, which made it possible to significantly increase the shelf life of food.

After heavy shellings of Mykolaiv and the region, there is a huge problem with high-quality drinking water due to the destruction of treatment as well as water supply facilities. Untreated water contains a lot of iron and salt, which makes it unsuitable for use, especially in medical services.

The project was created to assist the city of Mykolaiv in the form of water filtration units. Filters were received by 3 primary medical care centers of Mykolaiv.

The project was aimed at evacuating civilians from dangerous territories of Kharkiv oblast under threat of occupation. 784 people were evacuated.

Children were introduced to natural sciences through lectures, experiments, and master classes. They were also taught environmentally friendly way of life.

In connection with the active hostilities in the city of Kharkiv, many people have left their homes and live in bomb shelters that are not equipped with either heating or appliances for cooking.

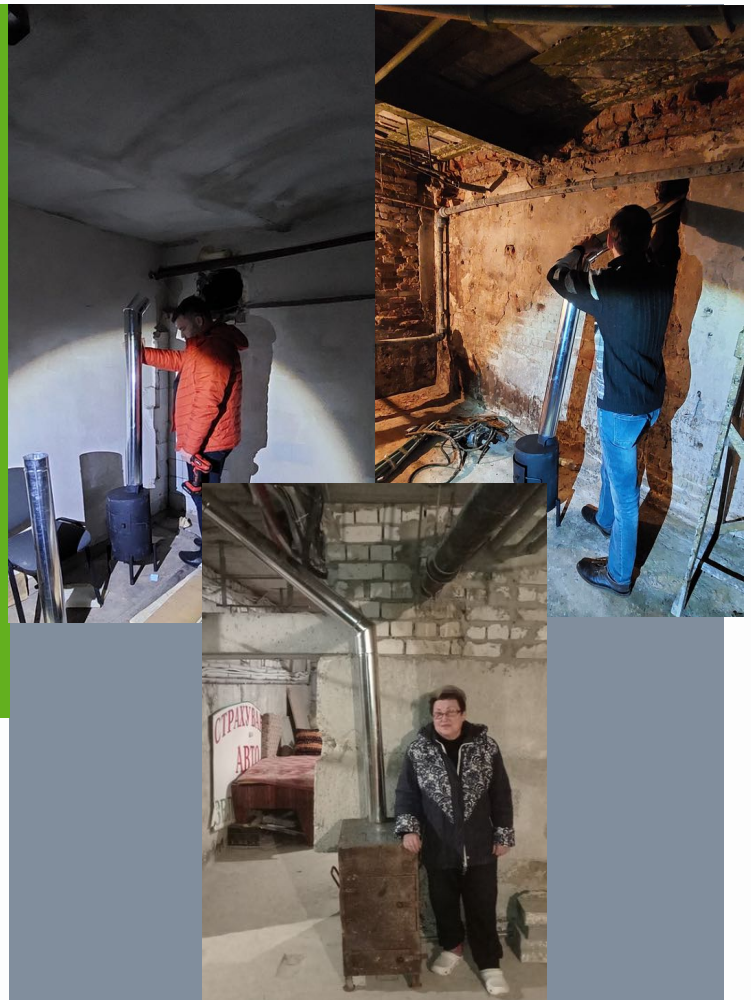
The project was aimed at equipping 15 bomb shelters in Kharkiv with potbelly stoves with cooking surfaces for a more comfortable stay for people.

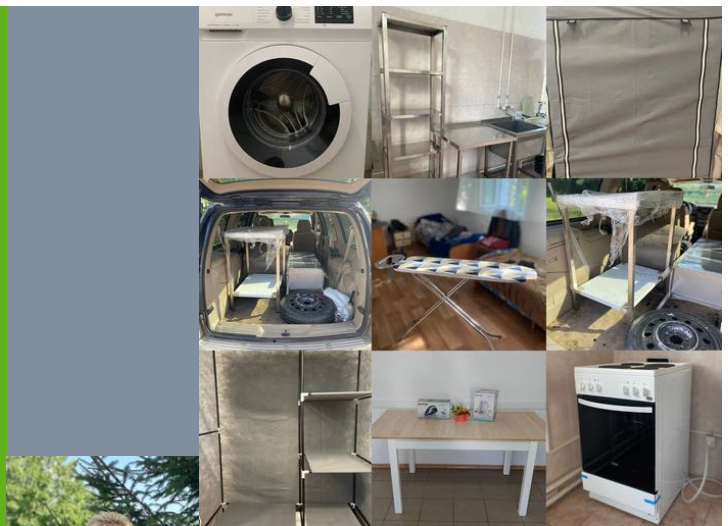

The project was aimed at purchasing a generator for the "100% of Life" medical center. Chernihiv" for a continuous work process during power outages. This medical center provides services for both HIV-positive people and the general population, as well as rapid testing for HIV/hepatitis C.

# Project profile

## NGO "Interregional Union of Poultry and Fodder Producers of Ukraine", Kharkiv region, project "Assistance to food security of the population and development of self-employment in poultry farming"

Numerous IDPs were recorded in Kharkiv region after the war started. In addition to that part of the oblast was occupied and people were forced to seek shelter in other communities. It is crucial to provide both residents of rural communities and IDPs with means of subsistence and food. Food security is one of the priorities, as during the war it is extremely important for people to be able to provide for themselves and their families.

The project was aimed at improving people's lives by issuing poultry kits to selected families and holding training webinars on micro-farming. One set consisted of: 25 - 1 day old meat-egg chicks, 35 - 1 day-old broiler chicks, 2 bags of compound feed, veterinary first-aid kit, feeder and drinker.

## Novgorod-Volyn city women's organization, Zhytomyr oblast, project "Rental point of essential items for IDPs"

In the conditions of full-scale aggression of the Russian Federation, the civilian population is forced to leave their homes. There are no household appliances and dishes necessary for life in the new housing for IDPs.

The project was aimed at improving the stay of IDPs in temporary shelters in the Novgorod-Volyn community. An electric kettle, iron, slow cooker, hair dryer, microwave oven, refrigerator, washing machine, blender and a set of kitchen utensils were purchased.

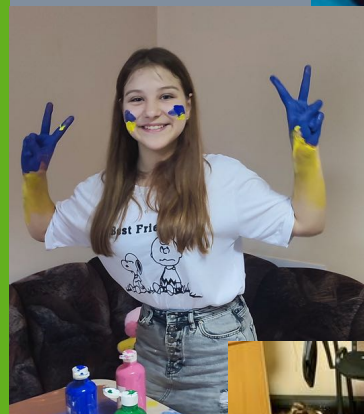

Evacuation trains also started to operate, but not all those willing to evacuate could reach them. This problem was especially acute for people with disabilities and the elderly.

The project was created to implement free evacuation of people with special needs and provide them with humanitarian aid for the road. Thanks to the implementation of the project, a folding ramp, auxiliary rehabilitation equipment, special equipment for volunteers and food kits were purchased.

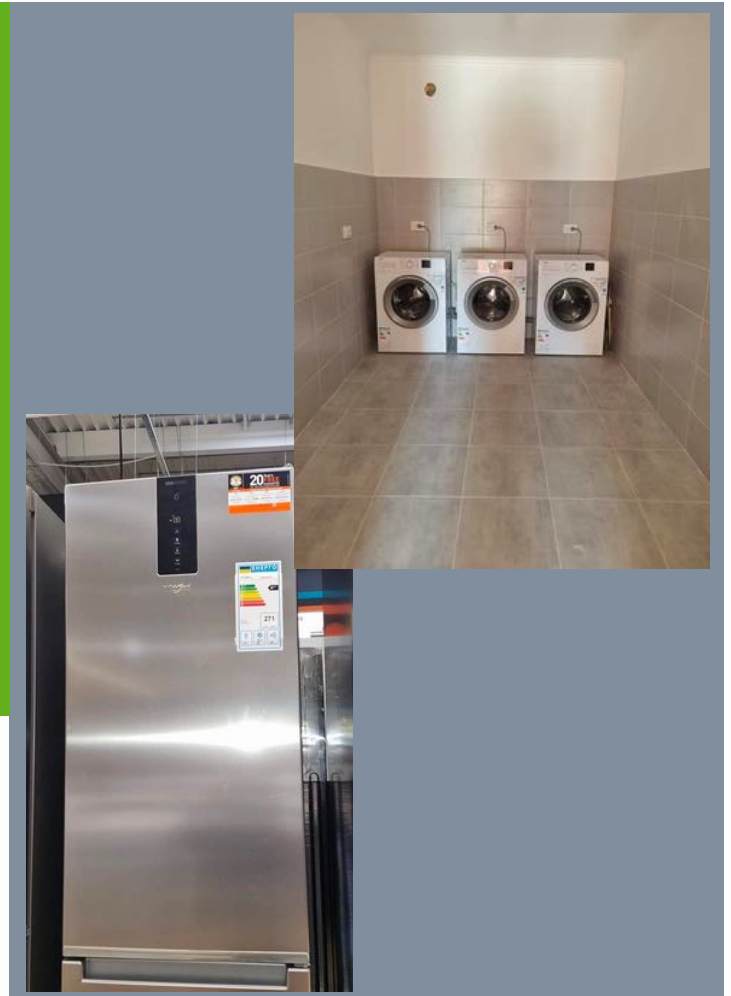
